Workshops

Thanks to everyone for sending in sign-ups for our workshops next year. We have nice registration for both the fall workshops and already have sign-ups for Toni's workshop in April 2020. Please note there are very good color pictures on our website www.chicagoang.org

We have three workshops planned for next year. A group of members reviewed and rated these choices so hopefully everyone will find them exciting. We have two workshops in the fall. Our first with Jennifer Riefenberg, *Pumpkin Patch* and next Sue Reed with another beautiful pilot program, *Four Square Diamond*. Toni Gerdes will join us in April for *Klimt Kimono*.

We are asking for earlier registration so we can get information to our teachers more quickly.

Please let us know if that is too difficult.

With changes in the board we are down to only one board member responsible for Workshops. We are asking for a Teacher Angel for each workshop to help spread some of the work. We are using the phrase Teacher Angel not Class Angel because the role has work outside the class. Our teachers generally fly into Midway on Friday afternoon. When we can it is nice to pick them up at the airport and take them to their hotel in Oakbrook Terrace. We also like to take them out to dinner on Friday night. On Saturday and Sunday morning the teacher needs to be picked up at the hotel and brought to our meeting location. During the actual workshop the Angel will help making coffee each morning and cleaning up at the end of the day. We also take our teachers out to dinner on Saturday night and return them to the airport on Sunday unless they are traveling on Monday. There are many guild members who can drop at the airport on Sunday. I take responsibility for making hotel reservations, providing lunch and snacks for the teacher and joining the Saturday night dinner unless I have an unavoidable conflict. With Pat's move to President I will also take responsibility for managing workshop registrations and calculating the amount each member owes and what we need to pay the teacher. Pam is graciously hosting Sue Reed in November, so we need Teacher Angels for Jennifer in October and Toni in April. Please email Joanne if you can help out, jem1811@gmail.com.

Over the years the Board has wrestle with the decision if ghosts are allowed or not for our workshops. In June the Board met and discussed this topic again because we had a member ask us to put it on the agenda. We decided to pilot the following ghost policy for a year or so and then discuss if it becomes a permanent policy. Our intent is to encourage members to attend workshops in person, we value the community, there is lots of teacher insights that are not included in the instructions and the experience of a full class is best for the teacher. On the other hand, we have members who really want to take a workshop and cannot due to a conflict. Given that context we decided if a teacher allows ghosts and we have fourteen members signed up to take the class in person we will allow up to three ghosts for the workshop. Ghosts are never allowed for pilot classes.

Workshops—cont.

A quick reminder about workshop policies: if you sign up for a workshop, you must attend at least one full day of the workshop. On occasion, the designer may specify that attendance both days is required. If the workshop is a pilot class you must attend both days.

Please be sure to check your schedule before signing up for a workshop to ensure you will be able to attend. Once you have been included in a workshop's final count, the \$25.00 workshop deposit is non-refundable unless your spot is filled from a workshop waiting list.

All sign-ups must be by mail, sent to Joanne McGowan 426 Fox Meadow Drive, Northfield IL 60093- 4301 and be accompanied by a \$25.00 deposit. A date, on or before which the workshop coupon may be mailed and considered as a first day registration is indicated on every coupon and published in this newsletter. Every coupon (with deposit) postmarked on or before the designated first day date will be considered a first day member registration. The deadline date to register will also be shown on the coupon and published in the newsletter. Workshops that have not filled will be open to non-members after this deadline date.

Non-members will be asked to pay a \$30.00 nonmember fee in addition to the workshop cost. The cost of our workshops includes many things. First there is the kit fee for the class that is really determined by the size of the piece and the number and type of threads. There is a large range in these costs from \$65.00 all the way up to \$220.00. We try to offer workshops with a variety of kit fees each year. Other costs include the instructor's teaching fee for two days, the instructor's travel costs which generally includes airfare and ground transportation to their home airport, the instructor's room and board for the weekend, if applicable, and the Park District room rental fee. We know that workshop prices have increased over the years and we do our best to minimize all costs so workshops remain affordable for the guild.

Keep in mind that you can sign up for any open workshop shown below as soon as your receive this newsletter. If you are going to wait and sign up later make sure you keep in mind the deadline date.

October 26th & October 27th, 2019 <u>Pumpkin Patch by Jennifer Riefenberg</u>

We are so glad to have Jennifer back with Chicago ANG. Jennifer Riefenberg is a Certified Teacher from the National Academy of Needlearts (NAN). She has taught many programs for ANG and EGA and teaches classes at TACtile, the Textile Arts Center. Chicago ANG had enjoyed all of Jennifer's workshops and is excited to offer this class that has been so popular at Seminar.

Autumn flashes its warm smiles of color in the Pumpkin Patch. A sampler of stitches creates the verdant earth on which the pumpkins sit in anticipation of harvest.

Enjoy this fun and elegant fall design. Course objectives include: enhancing the students' knowledge of designappropriate stitches; integrate warm/cool color combinations into the students' palette; and use of bright, intense color complements. Stitches will include the following concept/techniques: adapting and adjusting stitches to reflect the design shape; compensation of stitches; use of color in creating a sense of depth and form; and creating dimensional or dimensional-effect on vines with stitching and working over stitched areas.

Proficiency Level: Intermediate

Design Size: 6" x 8"

Kit Contents: #18 eggshell canvas, a variety of silk, cotton, wool, Rainbow Gallery Very Velvet, metallic, overdyes and solids, Tila beads, plus an assortment of yarns/materials for the stems.

November 16 & 17, 2019: Four Square Diamond by Sue Reed

We are always so happy to have Sue with us. She has taught at ANG national seminars multiple times. We will be piloting a piece that Sue will teach at national in 2020. Please note since this is a pilot attendance both days is required.

Sue has asked us to pilot this lovely piece. Patterns and stitches abound in this delightful yet challenging design. The four squares contain diamonds of various stitches (double fan, double fan doubled, arrow crescent, twisted star, eyelets, straight, and overlapping straight) and threads (Watercolours, Pepper Pot, Silk Lame 18). The softness of couched metallic braid and satin stitches are seen in the border stitches on the diamonds. The center crescent diamond is worked in Watercolours and Pepper Pot. To complete the squares, two stitches are used for the background: Nobuko and diagonal Roumanian. Looking closely at the placement of these stitches, you will see the subtleness of another diamond shape (with the overstitching in Petite Silk Lame) and the suggestion of an octagon (Nobuko). Pepper Pot Silk couched with Petite Silk Lame transitions from the squares and borders the herringbone. Note the herringbone is extended into the arms in a single journey and is mirror-imaged for the square border. This area is enhanced with overstitching in #4 Kreinik braid and Pepper pot Silks. A quiet outer border consisting of two rows of slanted Gobelin and shaded long-arm Greek cross "over 1" complete the design. Color choices to be determined. We will post on the website as soon as they are available. Kit includes: 13" x 13" line-drawn canvas, instruction booklet, all threads, needles.

Threads: Watercolours, 1 skein Pepper Pot Silk, 4 skeins (Model: 2 dark blue, 1 pale green, 1 shrimp) Splendor Silk, 3 cards Silk Lame 18, 1 card Petite Silk Lame, 2 cards Kreinik braid #4 and #12, 1 spool each

<u>April 18 & 19, 2020: Klimt Kimono by</u> <u>Toni Gerdes</u>

We are so happy to welcome Toni back to Chicago ANG. She has taught at ANG National Seminars multiple times and is a prolific designer which is so wonderful. We are fortunate enough to offer one of those designs, *Klimt Kimono*, as a workshop. It is an amazing piece. Toni holds Teacher's Certification through the National Academy of Neeldearts (NAN) and is currently serving on their board as NAN Coordinator.

Gustav Klimt may be best known for his painting *The Kiss* (1907-08), done during his Golden Phase. This kimono combines Kimpt's love of costume with elements of many of the Golden Phase paintings including *The Tree of Life* (1905) as well as *The Kiss*.

Workshops-(continued)

Combining many silk and metallic threads this "artist kimono" will make a wonderful commemoration of a historic artists' work.

Silks will include Planet Earth, City Needlework, Dinky Dyes and others and will create a beautiful intermediate level design on 18ct. sandstone canvas.

The design can be ordered as a square/rectangular pattern rather than the kimono pattern.

Enjoy the process of creating another "Art" Kimono (The Wright Kimono was the 1st and Mackintosh Rose Kimono was the 2nd).

Learn the history of Gustav Klimt, a symbolist painter of the Vienna Secession movement.

Work with the newest beautiful silk threads as well as some tried and true.

Explore the world of small stitches to fill the many earth tone filled areas

of the kimono.

Learn to highlight the design with several metallic threads.

October 26 – Judging Needlework Pieces

Donna Halpin, an ANG and NAN certified judge will be presenting "Stitch for the Judge? I Don't Think So!" at the October meeting. Her lecture will include examples of stitching, reasons for entering your piece in an exhibit and what characteristics are considered by judges when needlework is judged. She will also provide tips which may help move your stitching and finishing to the 'award worthy' level. Additionally, she will provide verbal reviews of selected pieces. Donna will critique up to three pieces, so if you want to see how your stitching stacks up, feel free to bring a piece. If there are more than three, we will hold a lottery.

December 7 – Woven Ribbons

Needlepointers March 2018

Deadline: October 26 (please make sure we have your correct email address as we will email the instructions a week preceding the meeting.

The design is a twist on a band sampler – instead of working the bands in parallel rows, they are worked to appear as woven ribbons. This ornament is a wonderful way to try out new color schemes or to use up your stash – only a few yards of each color is needed.

If you want to use threads from your stash, following is a guideline on how to choose your colors:

Overdyed thread with at least three colors

Color A - two different values

Color B - two different values

Color C - one value Overdye - Gloriana Threads Silk 115, Topiary Color A1 - Rainbow Gallery

Color C – Rainbow Gallery Rainbow Linen, R428, Burgundy

Version 2 - Firecracker

January 25 -- Needlepoint Heart by David McCaskill

Pre-Work: Please draw heart shape on canvas with #4 pencil.

This cute heart will be finished into a scissor case at a subsequent meeting. You can use this piece as a stash buster. The following threads are what David used for his:

*You only need 2 skeins of Watercolours if you want to make a cord to hang the case around your neck.

February 22 – Color Theory: A Short Version by Diane Herrmann

Deadline – January 25 (please sign up even though there is no cost to ensure that Diane has enough handouts for everyone)

Did you ever look at a project in a needlework magazine, and say "meh", but later see it in a different color way and say "WOW!"? Confidence in the use of color is something that can transform how you approach your needlework. Diane Herrmann hopes to give you an overview of some color theory that will help you better understand how your perception of color has an impact on your reactions to stitched (or painted) pieces. We will begin with basic vocabulary and learn how to use a few simple color tools so that you'll be more confident about choosing threads and fabrics for your needlework projects. Working with threads from a green or a violet color family, you will have the opportunity to sort them by hue and value. If you have a color wheel at home or in a stitch bag, bring it along for the program!






